

International Travel Information

- Travel Warnings - Issued when the DOS decides to recommend that Americans avoid travel to a certain country
- Travel Alerts - A means to disseminate information about terrorist threats and other relatively short-term and/or trans-national conditions posing significant risks to the security of American travelers
- Country Specific Information - Include such information as location of the U.S. Embassy/ Consulate in the country, unusual immigration practices, health conditions, minor political disturbances, unusual currency and entry regulations, crime and security information, and drug penalties

Travel registration is a free service provided by the U.S. Government to U.S. citizens who are traveling to, or living in, a foreign country. Registration allows you to record information about your upcoming trip abroad that the Department of State can use to assist you in case of an emergency. Americans residing abroad can also get routine information from the nearest U.S. embassy or consulate.

Crisis Abroad Involving American Citizens – Communication Means

If You Are in a Foreign Country Involved in a Crisis:

- Monitor the DOS, and home pages of the Bureau of Consular Affairs and the U.S. Embassy
- Contact your family to reassure them of your whereabouts and safety
- Contact the U.S. Embassy/Consulate if you need help

Overseas Security Advisory Council - OSAC

- OSAC - a U.S. Federal Advisory Committee to promote security cooperation between American business and private sector interests worldwide and the U.S. DOS.
- OSAC objectives:
 - Establish continuing liaison and to provide for operational security cooperation between DOS security functions and the Private Sector.
 - To provide for interchange of information between the Private Sector and the DOS concerning developments in the overseas security environment.
 - To coordinate security planning and implementation of security programs.
 - To recommend methods to protect the competitiveness of American businesses operating worldwide.
