Synopsis:

This hybrid webinar/in-person series will give you a fundamental understanding of establishing threat assessment and management capabilities for your organization. Threat assessment and management teams are intended to help proactively identify persons who may display warning signs of potential violence or other indicators of concern.

In addition to our industry partners, we highly encourage school administrators, teachers, and school resource officers to attend this series to learn how to protect our schools and students better.

The series kicks off with a presentation by representatives from the FBI's Behavioral Analysis Unit (BAU) on the fundamentals of violence threat assessment, the concepts of targeted violence, and the pathway to violence. Followed by a presentation about the role mental health plays in targeted violence, also delivered in a hybrid format. Wrapping up with partnering with local law enforcement and developing a threat assessment and management program at your organization.
